## City of El Cerrito – Adult Programs & Senior Services Division

**January 2025 – November 12, 2025**

The City of El Cerrito Recreation Department's Adult Programs & Senior Services Division continues to deliver high-quality programs and services that promote the health, engagement, and well-being of older adults in our community. Between January 2025 and November 12, 2025, participation and partnerships have expanded, reflecting the City's ongoing commitment to supporting a vibrant and connected senior community.

### Participation Highlights

- At least 910 unique seniors (ages 60+) participated in enrichment programs and fitness classes.
- 8,668 total individual program enrollments (ages 60+) for enrichment programs and fitness classes.
- 2,016 swim passes were sold to seniors aged 60+
- 1,132 drop-ins to Senior Social – a twice weekly drop-in gathering space where seniors enjoy coffee, doughnuts, and social games such as Mahjong and Chess.
- 2,915 one-way rides using Easy Ride Senior & Disabled Paratransit Service were provided between January – October 2025. Of those 2,915 rides, 2,369 were rides to/from the Community Center for Café Costa Senior Lunch Program, Senior Social and Respite program.

Participation continues to grow, demonstrating the community's interest in engaging, affordable, and accessible programs for older adults.

### New Programs

- Coffee & Conversations – launched February 2025, this program offers seniors a welcoming environment to connect with City representatives, share ideas, ask questions, and learn more about City services and resources that affect older adults.
  - 6 Coffee & Conversations were hosted between February 2025 and November 2025 with 165 seniors in attendance.

### Partnerships

- AARP Tax-Aide
  - Provide space and promotion for Tax Preparation Services.
  - Volunteer training & Tax Preparation appointments were hosted at the City of El Cerrito Hana Gardens space.
  - Free tax preparation services were provided for approximately 300 seniors.



- Twelve senior volunteers donated over 1,300 hours of service (between February – April 2025).
- HICAP (Health Insurance Counseling and Advocacy Program)
  - Provide space and promotion for HICAP services.
  - The City provides space at the Community Center for ongoing one-on-one counseling sessions.
  - The City invited HICAP to provide a group presentation at the Community Center on November 12, 2025, attended by 18 seniors.
- Senior Peer Counseling (Contra Costa Health Department)
  - Provide space and promotion for Senior Peer Counseling Services.
  - The City continues to provide space at the Community Center for one-on-one mental health and support counseling sessions for seniors at the Community Center.
- Age Well, Drive Smart (California Highway Patrol)
  - The City hosts CHP to provide safe driving classes for 14 seniors.
  - Hosting classes includes promotion, registration, and logistical coordination for classes.
- Alzheimer’s Awareness Presentation (Alzheimer’s Association)
  - The City partnered with the Alzheimer’s Association to host a free educational session attended by 37 seniors.
  - Hosting classes includes promotion, registration, and logistical coordination for classes.
- Meals on Wheels Educational Programs at the El Cerrito Community Center (the City hosted MOW instructors to provide the following programs on-site at the El Cerrito Community Center):
  - Balance & Fall Prevention Programs – A Matter of Balance (30+ enrollments)
  - Bingocize (274 enrollments).
  - Hosting classes includes promotion, registration, and logistical coordination for classes.
- Café Costa Senior Lunch Program offered in partnership with the Area Agency on Aging
  - 5,000+ nutritious meals were served to seniors aged 60+ at the Community Center between January and November 2025.
  - Introduced musical entertainment during Café Costa lunch hours. Senior Volunteer Musicians provided special musical entertainment during lunch.
    - There were 8 special musical performances during lunch between Jan-Nov 2025.
    - Four senior volunteer musicians performed each time.
  - Monthly birthday celebrations for seniors are held on the last Wednesday of each month during lunch.



- 2,369 free rides to and from the Community Center for Café Costa were offered using our Easy Ride Senior & Disabled Paratransit Service.

## Special Events

- Second Annual Older Americans Month Celebrations (May 2025)
  - The Perennials Improv Performance (30 attendees)
  - Tea Dance with live music (65 attendees).
- Line Dance Parties – two evening events promoting movement and connection; 165 seniors attended, with dance instruction led by a senior volunteer.
- Senior Resource Fair (October 2025) drew 190 seniors and featured 50 local service providers and vendors offering resources and support for older adults.
- Volunteer Appreciation Lunch (April 2025)
